



Prime Areas: Autumn 2

As communicators, speakers and listeners our children will:
(Communication and language)

Skills to develop:

- Enjoy listening to longer stories and can remember much of what happens.
- Use a wider range of vocabulary.
- Understand a question or instruction that has two parts.
- Understand 'why' questions.
- Develop their communication and begin to use correct tenses.
- Be able to express a point of view and to debate when they disagree with an adult or a friend,
- Understand how to listen carefully and why listening is important

Types of quality first teaching: Word Aware sessions – learning new vocabulary and concepts. Story times and Science lessons (Space).

Activities and Experiences: The following activities and experiences will support the development of children's spoken language: Tapestry Show and Tell Time, Small Circle Times, Social Groups, NELI programme for identified children.

Our curiosity cube will inspire and provoke discussion linked to our topic.

Word Aware: Our goldilocks and step on words will be identified for the topic. This vocabulary is identified on our knowledge organiser.

As our "Fantastic Growing selves" our children will:
(Personal, social and emotional development)

Skills to develop:

- Develop their sense of responsibility
- Show more confidence in new social situations.
- Increasingly follow rules, understanding why they are important
- Do not always need an adult to remind them of a rule.
- Help to find solutions to conflicts and rivalries.
- Develop appropriate ways of being assertive.
- Begin to understand how others might be feeling
- Use small motor skills to do things independently.

Types of quality first teaching: Circle times, friendship stories, songs, rewards and positive praise boards.

Activities and Experiences: PSED is developed through the following activities: Circle Times Friendship Stories, Class Rewards, Calm Corner Provision.

Specific Planned Content

As movers and shakers our children will:
(Physical Development)

Skills to develop:

- Are increasingly able to use and remember sequences and patterns of movements which are related to music and rhythm.
- Use one-handed tools and equipment
- Use a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils.

Types of quality first teaching: Spiral PE teaching, dough disco, brain breaks, Music Express teaching, visit from a Dentist.

Activities and Experiences: Funky finger challenges, Climbing Frame, 'Big' Construction, 'Small' Construction, Painting Wall, Dough disco

Enhancements to provision to develop specific skills will be linked to the topic.

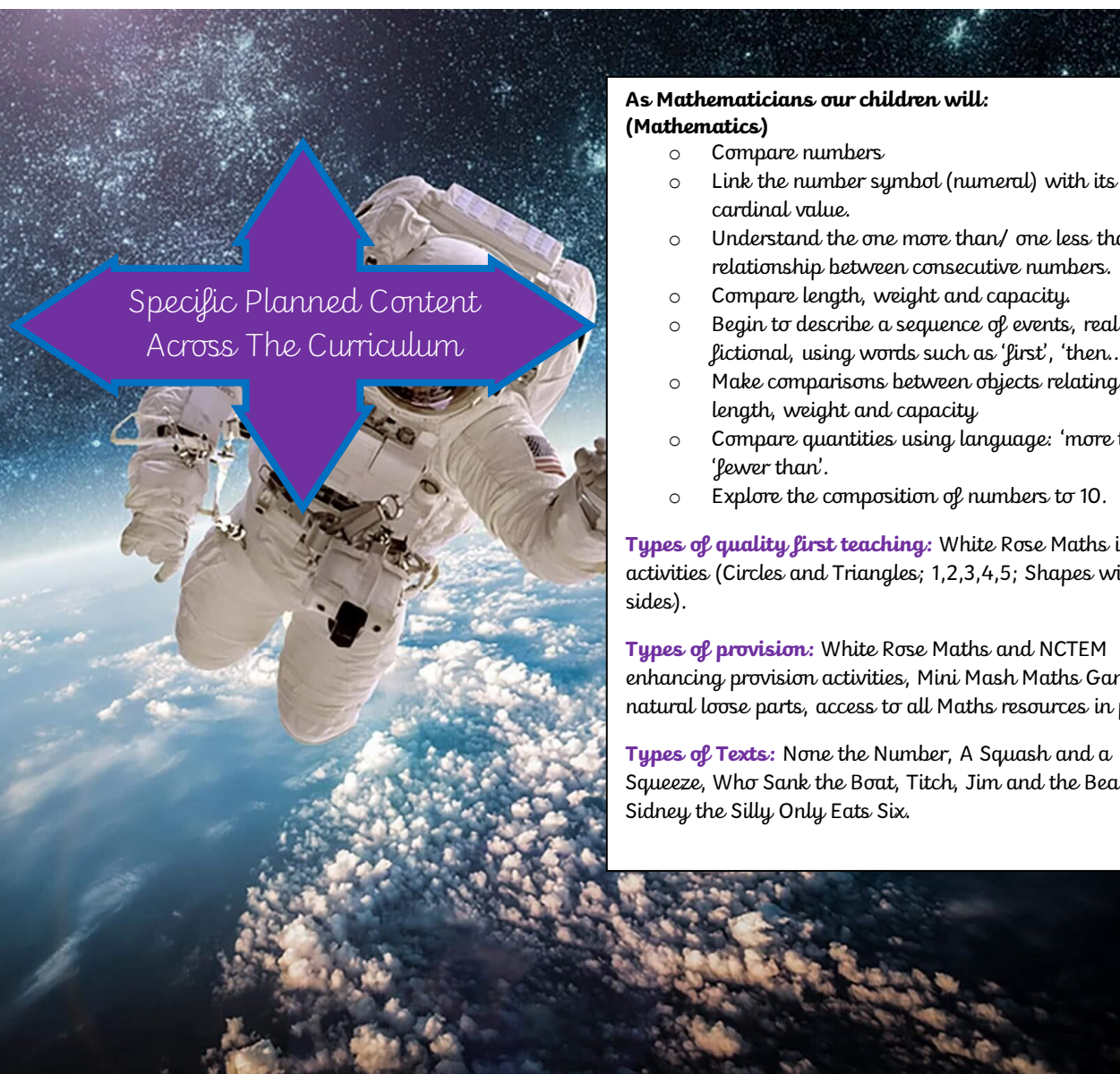
As Writers and Readers our children will: (Literacy)

- Write some or all of their name
- Write some letters accurately.
- Read individual letters by saying the sounds for them.
- Blend sounds into words, so that they can read short words made up of known letter-sound correspondences.
- Read some letter groups that each represent one sound and say sounds for them.
- Read a few common exception words matched to the school's phonic programme.

Types of quality first teaching: Phonics Bugs, shared writing (lists, labels and captions), story sequencing, fictional writing, explanations and setting descriptions.

Types of provision: Mini Mash name writing games, sand and salt trays, roll out paper, notebooks and pens, painting wall, phonics games and challenges, such as bingo, word hunts, obstacle courses, listening games and sorting games.

Types of Texts: Man on the Moon, The 3 Little Aliens and the Big Bad Robot, Beegu, Look Up!, Look inside: Space, The traditional Christmas story.



As Mathematicians our children will: (Mathematics)

- Compare numbers
- Link the number symbol (numeral) with its cardinal value.
- Understand the one more than/ one less than relationship between consecutive numbers.
- Compare length, weight and capacity.
- Begin to describe a sequence of events, real or fictional, using words such as 'first', 'then...
- Make comparisons between objects relating to size, length, weight and capacity
- Compare quantities using language: 'more than', 'fewer than'.
- Explore the composition of numbers to 10.

Types of quality first teaching: White Rose Maths input activities (Circles and Triangles; 1,2,3,4,5; Shapes with 4 sides).

Types of provision: White Rose Maths and NCTEM enhancing provision activities, Mini Mash Maths Games, natural loose parts, access to all Maths resources in play.

Types of Texts: None the Number, A Squash and a Squeeze, Who Sank the Boat, Titch, Jim and the Beanstalk, Sidney the Silly, Only Eats Six.

(Understanding of the World)

Skills to develop:

- Explore how things work
- Explore and talk about different forces they can feel
- Talk about the differences between materials and changes they notice

Types of quality first teaching and provision: Exploring Tim Peake, Neil Armstrong, Mae Jemison, Knowledge of the planets, sun and moon, Experimenting with light and shadows, space role play and small world area

As explorers and creators our children will:
(Expressive Arts and Design)

Skills to Develop:

- Explore colour and colour-mixing
- Using drawings to represent ideas like movement and loud noises
- Create collaboratively sharing ideas, resources and skills
- Explore, use and refine a variety of artistic effects
- Sing the pitch of a tone sung by another person
- Sing the melodic shape of familiar songs
- Create their own songs or improvise a song around one they know

Types of quality first teaching and provision: Music Express, Purple Mash drawing and painting activities. Paper mache planets, Chalking the planets, Sketching the moon, Firework pictures
