



Written Statement of Behaviour Principles – Governors

- Every pupil understands that they have the right to feel safe, valued and respected.
- All pupils, staff and visitors are free from any form of discrimination.
- Positive behaviour must be modelled, expected, encouraged and praised. Staff and volunteers set an excellent example to pupils at all times.
- Consistency must be used across all adult interactions with children, encouraging children to make positive choices.
- Consequence with appropriate sanctions take place when behaviour is not acceptable, following the consistent approach in the Relationship and Behaviour policy.
- The Relationship and Behaviour policy is understood by pupils, staff and communicated to parents and carers.
- The Exclusions policy explains that exclusions will only be used as a last resort, and outlines the processes involved in permanent and fixed-term exclusions.
- Pupils are helped to take responsibility for their actions.
- Families are involved and communicated with when behaviour is not to the standard expected, ensuring they understand the process that has taken place. It is important to form good relationships between the school and pupils' home life.
- The school will make appropriate adaptations to the Relationships and Behaviour policy for children with special educational needs.

The Governing Body also emphasises that violence or threatening behaviour will not be tolerated.

This written statement of behaviour principles is reviewed and approved by the Governing Board at Deighton Gates Primary School and is reviewed every 3 years with the Behaviour Policy.
